

1 **MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING** of the City Council of the City of Orange City, Florida,  
2 held on Tuesday, February 11, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. in Council Chambers, 201 N. Holly Avenue, Orange  
3 City.

4  
5 **CALL TO ORDER**

6  
7 The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by the City Clerk.

8  
9 Mr. Reischmann advised that due to the absence of the Mayor and Vice Mayor, according the Council's  
10 Rules and Procedures, the City Clerk will open the meeting, take role call and ask Council to appoint a  
11 temporary chair for this meeting.

12  
13 Ms. Thomas took the roll call.

14  
15 **ROLL CALL**

20 **Council Member Mahoney moved to appoint Council Member Allebach as**  
21 **temporary chairman, seconded by Council Member Harper, the motion passed**  
22 **by unanimous voice vote of the City Council.**

26 The Invocation was given by Phyllis Bartle-St. Jude Episcopal Church, followed by the Pledge of  
27 Allegiance.

33 Presentation: Historic Preservation Board Annual Update

34  
35 Donna Cobb, Chair of the Historic Preservation Board, came forward to provide Council with an annual  
36 update of the Board. Ms. Cobb provided a PowerPoint presentation (a copy of which is attached and  
37 becomes a permanent part of these minutes.) She discussed the duties and responsibilities of the Board,  
38 permit reviews for historic homes, Orange City Walking Tour, and CRA Façade Grants.

40 Ms. Cobb reported on the events the Board has attended, new Historic District Banners, quarterly  
41 newsletter articles, local register of historic places, National Preservation Month, achievements and  
42 activities for the Board, and the projects in progress.

44 The Council thanked Ms. Cobb and the Historic Preservation Board for all they do.

22 Mr. Reischmann read the title of Ordinance No. 628 into the record.

24 Becky Mendez, Development Services Director, came forward and stated that no changes have been made

25 since first reading and staff recommends Council approve Ordinance No. 628 at second and final reading.

27 **Council Member Mahoney moved to approve Ordinance No. 628, seconded by**  
28 **Council Member Crippen, the motion passed by a 5/0 roll call vote of the City**  
29 **Council.**

38 Mr. Reischmann read the title of Resolution No. 991-20 into the record.

40 Council Member Marks stated that Ms. Nunez could not be present due to a fractured foot.

42 **Council Member Mahoney moved to approve Resolution No. 991-20, seconded**  
43 **by Council Member Crippen, the motion passed by a 5/0 roll call vote of the City**  
44 **Council.**

46 **8. DISCUSSION AND ACTION:**

- 48 A. Discuss Improving the Intersection of Enterprise Road and US 17/92
- 49

1 Ms. Mendez stated that Council has requested staff research the road conditions at Enterprise Road and  
2 Highway 17-92. She provided a PowerPoint presentation (a copy of which is attached and becomes a  
3 permanent part of these minutes.) Ms. Mendez discussed the Enterprise Road and US 17-92 intersection,  
4 the March 2015 City Council Workshop, several traffic studies, and the Transportation Planning  
5 Organization call for projects.

6  
7 Ms. Mendez stated that staff recommends Council assess the results of the FDOT intersection safety study  
8 due by August 2020.

9  
10 **B. Consideration of Installing Veterans Only Parking Signs**

11  
12 Chaleak Jones, Executive Assistant to the City Manager, provided a PowerPoint presentation (a copy of  
13 which is attached and becomes a permanent part of these minutes.) Ms. Jones reported that the City is  
14 considering the install of veteran only parking spots, including signs throughout the City. She noted that  
15 the locations considered were based on current City parking lot usage.

16  
17 Ms. Jones provided the three recommended locations throughout the City, the sign options and the costs.

18  
19 The Council Members thanked Ms. Jones for presenting this item.

20  
21 **Council Member Marks moved to authorize the City to install the Veterans only**  
22 **parking signs, seconded by Council Member Harper, motion passed by a 5/0 roll**  
23 **call vote.**

25 **9. REPORTS:**

27 **A. City Manager**

29 Ms. Arrington had no report at this time and stated that she was available for any questions from the  
30 Council.

31  
32 Council Member Crippen inquired about the completion of Graves Avenue. Ms. Arrington replied that  
33 the City is anticipating the street will be available for travel approximately April/May of 2020. Final  
34 completion will be in August 2020.

35  
36 The Council commented about the amount of traffic throughout the detoured streets.

44 Mr. Reischmann stated that action is taking place in Tallahassee in regards to attacks against Home Rule.

46 Ms. Arrington stated that response has been sent to our local representatives directly regarding the actions  
47 against Home Rule.

3 Ms. Arrington reported that the City passed the recent total trihalomethanes (TTHM) water inspection.

7 **12. COUNCIL & MAYOR’S COMMENTS AND REPORTS**

9 Council Member Marks reported that she attended the State of the County. She thanked the Historic Board  
10 and staff for the accomplishments.

11  
12 Council Member Harper reported that he has been following the Legislature and is very interested in  
13 staying on top of the issues that arise concerning Home Rule. He stated that he is looking forward to the  
14 “Everybody is Somebody” event at Mill Lake Park.

15  
16 Council Member Crippen applauded the efforts of the Historic Preservation Board and stated that he was  
17 very proud of their accomplishments. He voiced concerns about the potential cuts of revenue to  
18 municipalities that could result from a demolished Home Rule. Council Member Crippen complimented  
19 staff in regards to the Strategic Planning meeting.

20  
21 Council Member Mahoney agreed with Council Member Crippen’s comments regarding the Strategic  
22 Planning Workshop. He complimented staff and Council Member Allebach.

23  
24 Council Member Allebach stated that the Strategic Planning meeting was a success. He thanked Council  
25 Member Harper for following the Legislature in Tallahassee.

29 Council Member Allebach entertained a motion to adjourn.

31 **Council Member Crippen moved to adjourn the City Council meeting, seconded**  
32 **by Council Member Harper, the meeting was adjourned by a unanimous voice vote**
